The Arm Research Summit Code of Conduct promotes inclusivity, fairness and professional behaviour before, during and after the conference to ensure delegates feel safe and comfortable to engage in all elements of the Summit.

By submitting work and/or attending the Arm Research Summit, delegates agree to adhere to the Code of Conduct, and we ask that any instances where the Code is not followed, are reported, to enable us to maintain the collaborative and open atmosphere of the Summit. To make a report or complaint at any point before, during or after the Summit, please refer to the 'Procedure to Report' section.

The Code of Conduct

The Arm Research Summit provides an inclusive forum for delegates to discuss their research ideas and projects. Equality, diversity and fairness are at the forefront of the Summit, and action will be taken against any form of harassment and bullying, inappropriate, unprofessional and disruptive behaviour, including, but not limited to:

- Harassment – sexual, stalking, harassing photography or videography
- Unwelcome attention – inappropriate physical contact and any uninvited attention
- Unsolicited comments – Vulgar exchanges, derogatory name-calling, and diminutive characterizations considered to be sexist, racist, ageist, and transphobic (including identity)
- Disruptive behaviour – Disorderly conduct, including fighting, coercion, theft, damage to property or mistreatment to other delegates during networking hours, presentations, workshops, demonstrations and posters
- Any form of discrimination – Exclusionary remarks, religion, medical conditions, physical/intellectual abilities, pregnancy, ancestry, personal attacks

Scientific Misconduct

Fabrication, falsification and plagiarism in any submission will be treated as scientific misconduct. Any submission suspected to demonstrate scientific misconduct will be removed from consideration for the program and appropriate bodies notified as necessary.

Procedure to Report

- In person – To report an incident during the Summit to one of the Organizing Committee members, please head to the Registration Desk.
